
Thunder Bay Quilters' Guild 2009-2010 Block of the Month

All blocks are 8" finished (so 8 ½" x 8 ½" after making each one)

BOM #7



Corners (BG)	2 ½" x 2 ½" - need 4
Center (color 1)	3 ¼" x 3 ¼" - need 2
(color 3)	3 1/4" x 3 1/4" - need 2
Flying geese (BG)	2 ½" x 4 ½" - need 4
(color 2)	2 ½" x 2 ½" - need 8

Make 4 flying geese units:

- 1. lightly draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 8 square (2 ½" color 2)
- 2. place 1 on the end of the BG 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle
- 3. Sew on the drawn line and press towards color 2.
- 4. trim the excess
- 5. repeat with another 2 ½" color 2 square sewing it to the other side of this rectangle so you end up with a goose that looks like



Making the center block (half square triangles (hst)):

- 6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of either the color 1 or color 3 squares (3 $\frac{1}{4}$ ") whichever is a lighter color
- 7. Place a 3 ¼" color 1 and color 3 square right sides together and sew ¼" on each side of the line you drew. Cut on the line you drew. Press to darker color. Repeat with other 2 pieces. You have 4 hst's. Square up to 2 ½".
- 8. Sew the half square triangles together to make a 4 ½" x 4 ½" center block as shown

Put the block together:

- 9. sew a flying geese unit to 2 opposite sides of the center block. Press to center block
- 10. sew a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " corner square to each side of the other 2 flying geese units. Press to corners.
- 11. sew the units from step 2 to the top and bottom of the unit made in step 1 so that it looks like the diagram. Press to center block. It should measure 8 ½"
