If you've made a selvage project feel free to bring it along for a show & tell. The picture shows selvages used as the background for the birds - I can't remember what quilt show this was in.

If you have selvages you want to donate to Diane she'll happily take them. The selvage should have at least 1/2" of the fabric besides the selvage. Those with pretty color dots or names of fabric lines are great. If anything has any Cotton & Steele selvages they are the best since they sometimes exceed 1" and often have cute sayings and pictures on them.

This will allow the committee to plan the 3 meals and the room layout. Thanks for understanding.

We are planning for a <u>nut free</u> event due to allergies. Please consider this if you are bringing snacks or dessert to share. Dinner will include beef on a bun and we will have vegetarian soup available as well.

Here are the details about the bee: Saturday, February 1, 2020 - 10 am - 9 pm Sunday, February 2, 2020 - 10 am - 4 pm Oliver Road Community Centre

We will have the following available for you to work on at the bee:

- 1. Ouilt Kits
- 2. String Quilts quilt as you go, hinge method. These will be assembled by teams to keep them coordinated and to expedite finishing.
- 3. Machine Quilting quilt tops of various sizes
- 4. Quilts ready for binding

Help with general tasks is always welcome and encouraged. This year we will have a white board at the entrance where people can volunteer to help. We need help with non-Quilting tasks too. There will be a lot of work for people who don't want to sew. It is very much appreciated and makes the weekend more enjoyable for everyone.

If anyone plans to machine quilt a charity quilt and would like to baste a quilt in advance to work on it at the bee, please email Adrienne <u>alopes@tbaytel.net</u> in advance of the meeting to arrange to have a top, batting and backing provided to you. That allows you to do your basting at home and be ready to start quilting at the bee.

If you are attending the bee, please plan to bring the following:

- Name tag
- Indoor shoes we would like to minimize mud and water in the main hall and will encourage everyone to leave outdoor shoes at the entrance. Coats can be hung in the coat room. We will make sure there are a few chairs at the entrance to help with putting shoes on and off.
- Covered coffee/tea mug and water bottle
   Nut free dessert to share please indicate any other allergens or provide a list of ingredients (thanks)

If you are bringing a sewing machine please bring the following:

- Extension cord/power bar



# **COMFORT QUILTS**

Happy New Year.

In December we enjoyed an awesome potluck and lots of Show& Tell. Four comfort quilts were collected and will be kept for distribution after the Quilt Bee and February meeting. If you find yourself with free time, try a Figit quilt. Figit quilts are small textured touchy/feely blankets or squares that are washable and safe for

children and seniors. They are wonderful items to amuse and

occupy time.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see Kelly Schmid or Peggy Skillen for a Quilt Guild Label. The label is to be sewn onto the quilt; typically on the back bottom right side. We will be challenging members to make bed quilts for long-term care facilities as there is a big need for these. Other quilts are always welcomed too. No label goes onto the Neo Natal.

# **Recommended Quilt Sizes**

Neo Natal 36" x 36"

Crib 34 to 36" x 36"

Wheel Chair 36" x 48"

Nap Quilt 40" x 55 - 60"

Bed 63 to 65" x 80"

Jackie Black is piecing together larger quilts using the quilted 12 ½ inch blocks. Please keep bringing them in. Blocks can be any pattern but we are requesting that colours be kept neutral so they can be used by male and female residents. Remember to sandwich larger (about 14 inch backing and batting) and leave them untrimmed. It is a wonderful way to try out a pattern you find in a magazine or on-line. Come find Jackie or me if you have questions.

I will be away with family until late February. Kelly Schmid and Peggy Skillen are available if you have any questions. Kelly will be collecting the quilts until I return as Florence will likely miss both meetings too. Thanks to all the Comfort Quilt Committee for helping out.
