 - 2.2.4 Webmaster

• Change #4:

- Add: Guest Quilter Committee to list of Standing Committees
- Change Vice-President (Roles and Responsibilities) to the following:
 - The **Vice President** will preside at meetings in the absence of the President; liaise with the Program Chair(s) and be responsible for coordinating the workshops and retreats. internal workshops.
- Add the following to the Roles and Responsibilities of the Guest Quilter Committee
 - The Guest Quilter Committee will be responsible for coordinating workshops and retreats with external instructors.


CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES



COMFORT QUILTS

Greetings,

In February 27 lap-sized and 7 bed-sized comfort quilts were collected along with 2 neo natal blankets. Thanks to the successful Quilt Bee and efforts by Guild members, the Comfort Quilt Committee members will soon be meeting to distribute quilts received since November. An update on locations will be provided next meeting.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see me or another Committee member for a Quilt Guild Label. The label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on the back bottom right side. We are still challenging members to make bed quilts for long-term care facilities as there is a big need for these. Other quilts are always welcomed too. No label goes onto the Neo Natal.

Jackie Black has been piecing together larger quilts using the quilted 12 ½ inch blocks. Please keep bringing them in. Blocks

can be any pattern but we are requesting that colours be kept neutral so they can be used by male and female residents. Remember to sandwich larger (about 14 inch backing and batting) and leave them untrimmed. It is a wonderful way to try out a pattern you find in a magazine or on-line. Come find Jackie or me if you have questions.

Sometimes we receive requests for specific need such as a Dignity Quilt to be used in a Senior's Home for the celebration of life when someone passes. The Guild criteria for Comfort Quilts is that we don't provide quilts in response to specific requests. We would be unable to accommodate all the requests. However, Guild members are encouraged to help out within the community and, if interested, can take on the requested work. Often facilities or individuals will reimburse for the cost of supplies. If interested, please see one of the Guild Executives for more information.
