### SEW DAYS

Sew days will continue this year with few changes and 6 tentative dates. The cost has risen to \$10 but still includes lunch.

And we are looking for members for the committee to make food and assist with set up/take down Dates. October 19, November 23, January 25, February 29, March 21, May 23 and will run 10 - 4.

### **PROGRAM**

### October

Disappear Blocks and similar block transformations. This was originally going to be the November program but I decided to switch Oct and Nov so that you might get inspired and try a few techniques making teddy bear quilts. So by doing the demos in October it will give you time to do last minute teddy quilts. I invite anyone who has done a quilt using a disappearing block to bring it for the program. All participants get their name in for a draw prize.

There are attachments to the Quill with a list of video links and block patterns you can try. There are sew many disappearing blocks patterns now if you start doing some research on the web.

### November

Ruler foot quilting. I know there has been quite a bit of interest and Dori has run a few classes in these rulers that you use to help you quilt. These are not the rulers you use to cut your fabric. If anyone has a favorite ruler they wish to talk about then bring it along. Or bring samples of items you've quilting with rulers. I'll have some for people to see and some examples. Some rulers just work with long-arm machines, some are specially made for domestic machines and some can be used by both.

### **UFO** Challenge

November is the final meeting to tell me which quilts you finished off your list. For each one done you get your name into the draw for some great prizes. I'll have the lists at the Oct meeting or email me your updated list

### Fall Mystery Quilt - final part

If anyone has any questions then ask me at the meeting. I've had a few people ask in classes or if they've seen me. This month is the final part. The final runner will be at the October meeting. I did some applique in the center and quilted it. The applique pattern and final instructions are attached. I've given you 2 sizes for the poinsettias. After I finished I thought they'd look better a bit bigger so I gave you both sizes. Feel free to place your holly and poinsettias anywhere you wish.



### **PROGRAM**

I ran across this the other day and thought it might be interesting to put in the Quill. the prices are American so we'd have to double them. Their long arm rates are cheap too. I know when people ask about buying quilts they have no idea what the true cost is. Luci gets that in the store a lot too.

### Why Do Quilts Cost So Much?

Costs for materials, construction, & finishing for a 65" x 65" Throw Quilt.

### Materials for throw quilt:

### Fabric for the top:

6 yds @ \$11 yd = \$66

5 yds Backing @ \$13 = \$65

2 yds of Batting @ \$11 = \$22

5/8 yd for Binding @ \$11 = \$6.88

TOTAL Cost of Materials = \$159.88

### Construction:

(Labor based on \$10/hr) Making the top:

(Includes preparing the fabric, cutting the pieces, sewing the blocks, setting into rows, adding borders)

50 hours x \$10/hr = \$500

### Assembling the Quilt Sandwich:

3 hours @ \$10/hr = \$30

### Quilting on Domestic Machine:

(Charged by square inch in a simple all over design)

4225 si x \$.015 = \$63.38

Thread for Quilting - \$15

TOTAL Cost for Construction = \$768.26

### Finishing:

Making the Binding:

2 hours x \$10 = \$20


Attaching the binding:

10 hours x \$10 - \$100

TOTAL Finishing costs = \$120

TOTAL COST OF QUILT = \$888.26

Note: A larger quilt, a more intricate pattern, a more elaborate quilting design will cause the price to increase.



### **COMFORT QUILTS**

Greetings, in September we collected 20 quilts, 2 figits, 7 neo natal blankets and 14 quilted squares. Figit quilts are small textured touchy/feely blankets or squares that are washable and safe for children and seniors. They are wonderful items to amuse and occupy time. We have some pattern suggestions if anyone is interested or there are lots of options if you search on the internet. We have some supplies of lace, textured fabrics and other notions so let us know if you want some starter materials.

If you are making any quilt(s) for donation, the recommended sizes are given here. Also, see

Pat or Florence for a Quilt Guild Label. The label is to be sewn onto the quilt – typically on

the back bottom right side. We will be challenging members to make bed quilts for long-term care facilities as there is a big need for these. Other quilts are always welcomed too. Thanks

<b>Recommended Quilt Sizes</b>			
Neo Natal	36" x 36"		
Crib	34 to 36" x 36"		
Wheel Chair	36" x 48"		
Nap Quilt	40" x 55 - 60"		
Bed	63 to 65" x 80"		

One on-going Committee tasks is to review and update the list of locations that receives Comfort Quilts. If you know of any location that may benefit from receiving a quilt or quilts, please provide contact and background information. The aim has been to support facilities where quilts will be used multiple times and benefit the users.

We are thrilled that Jackie Black is willing to continue to piece together larger quilts using quilted 12 ½ inch blocks. Last meeting we receive 14 blocks thanks to some busy quilting over the summer. Please keep bringing them in. Blocks can be any pattern but we are requesting that colours be kept neutral so they can be used by male and female residents. Remember to sandwich larger (about 14 inch backing and batting) and leave them untrimmed. It is a wonderful way to try out a pattern you find in a magazine or on-line. Come find Jackie or me if you have questions.
