

- If you purchased a kit it is \$20. I'll be in the lobby before the meeting. If you pay by cheque make it out to the Thunder Bay Quilters Guild. Or I'll take cash.
- For those who purchased the kit, you'll notice that the binding isn't in the bag this time. That's because there we so many fabrics to choose from I had a hard time deciding so I made a deal with Luci (Circle of Friends Quilt Shoppe). There's a coupon in the bag that entitles you to the 0.2m for your binding (good enough for 3 strips 2 1/2"). Take it to Luci's shop and pick out your own you must surrender your coupon. The coupons expire at the end of October. But after finishing part 1 you can probably decide on the binding.

COMFORT QUILTS

Greetings, in June there were 14 quilts donated at the meeting. These quilts were taken and others collected were taken to Pinewood, Grace Place, John Hopkins and the new respite and long-term care facility opening, the Lodge on Dawson Road.

Comfort Quilt Committee members are responsible for the collection of quilts donated and the distribution to local facilities. Last year more than 160 comfort quilts were donated to local facilities including bed-sized quilts for some new respite beds. Many of the Seniors' homes now have respite care beds and appreciate the larger sized quilts. Comfort Quilts are made in the Bees and independently by members and groups.
